## **HEALER'S RESPONSIBILITY TO THE SELF**

Healers and students must take responsibility for the self and not put yourself in a situation that is beyond your capabilities.

Healers and students should be aware of their own health and only give healing if they are certain they are fit to do so.

## **MEMBERSHIP**

On becoming a member of HEA you are joining an organisation dedicated to bringing the benefits of Spiritual Healing to as many people as possible.

HEA is an organisation registered as a charity with HMRC and its aims and objectives are that the charity is run with care and compassion, there is no chair and everyone is equal. It is a safe home for spiritual healers.

## **MEMBERSHIP CATEGORIES OF HEA**

Healer	Two years training incorporating, 4 training courses completed, and an assessment panel passed.
Student	Undergoing training as above.
Friends	Non healers who show their appreciation and support for spiritual healing.

## **THE HEALING ACT AND HEALER CONDUCT**

- A healer's behaviour must not include any action or actions that could be misconstrued or be interpreted as indecent assault, harassment or discrimination.
- A healer must always be aware of their own safety especially when healing in private, at their own homes or at the homes of their client. When seeing clients with known addictions or unstable mental illnesses healers should always be accompanied by another healer. Healers must give healing within their own capability.
- A healer should always dress appropriately, have a high standard of personal hygiene and limit the use of perfumes/aftershave/deodorants. It is advisable not to have eaten strong food which leaves an after effect such as garlic.
- A healer should not ask a client to remove any item of clothing except for a coat or shoes and possibly glasses.
- A healer must not use manipulation or vigorous massage.
- A healer must not refer to guides or disincarnate bodies.
- Under the umbrella of HEA a healer must only give Spiritual Healing and is only insured for Spiritual Healing. Trance healing and psychic surgery are not permitted and are not covered by HEA insurance, nor are other alternative therapies.
- A healer must not use clairvoyance or mediumship during a healing session.
- A healer must always ensure their client is grounded and in a state of full consciousness before they leave.
- A healer must not disclose any personal information about the client without their prior consent unless required to do so by law.

- A healer is required to keep records of healing sessions. These should be brief, factual and avoid opinion. They must comply with the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) and the Data Protection Act 2018. A client is allowed to see their record.
- A healer may charge for their services but must act with sensitivity regarding fees or donations. A healer must comply with local authority regulations in regard to use of premises for business purposes and be aware of their status with the Inland Revenue.
- A healer member can request that their name is made available on HEA referral list which is shown on the HEA website.
- A healer may advertise but the content should be dignified and must not claim any cures or give any testimonials
- In the unlikely event of a complaint against a healer, the healer should deal with the matter promptly by giving the complainant details of the National Standards Officer (NSO). Complaints and disciplinary procedures are dealt with by the NSO. Contact details for the NSO of HEA can be found in our web site or by contacting a committee member.

## GUIDANCE FOR WORKING WITH HEALTH PROFESSIONALS

- A healer must always respect and work with all other health professionals.
- Healing should be carried out without fuss and if another patient requests healing permission should again be sought from the ward manager.
- A healer must never wear any type of clothing that could give the impression they are part of the medical staff.
- A healer must be friendly and courteous at all times and respect the hospital's policies and procedures.

## TREATING ANIMALS

- A healer must be aware of the law regarding the treatment of animals and should not give healing to an animal unless the owner has taken the animal to a vet, unless it is an emergency situation such as an accident.
- Giving healing to an animal then becomes the same as giving healing to a person and all codes of conduct apply.

## HEALING AND THE LAW

A healer must comply with the statutory laws of the land in relation to healing. Comprehensive information can be found on **UK HEALERS** website, (*see Healers and the Law*). The main laws to be aware of are:

- Confidentiality
- Medical treatment
- Safeguarding of Children and Vulnerable Adults
- Sexually transmitted diseases
- Dentistry
- Midwifery
- Selling remedies, herbs, medicines, alternative remedies etc.
- A healer must ask a new client if they have seen a doctor, if they have not, a healer should recommend that they do so.

- A healer must always support the medical professions recommended treatment, if a client expresses doubts about their medical treatment the healer should advise them to return to their doctor and discuss it with them
- A healer must never diagnose or recommend any kind of treatment.
- A healer visiting a client in hospital should present themselves to the person in charge of the ward and show their membership card and ask permission to give healing. Proof of membership should be shown

## HEALING SESSION

- A healer must always obtain consent for contact healing otherwise it could be construed as an assault. A healer must never touch a client anywhere inappropriate that could cause embarrassment or be taken as an assault.
- Give a brief explanation the act of healing to the client. Explain what they may feel during the healing session, eg heat, tingling and that they feel emotional. Be prepared for a client to become tearful.
- Never promise a cure, diagnose, interfere with their life style, be judgemental or comment on their religious beliefs.

## CHILDREN, CHILD PROTECTION, MEDICAL TREATMENT FOR PEOPLE UNDER 18 YEARS.

- A healer must obtain parental consent for a child under the age of 18, unless the child is married (ie: aged between 16-18).
- A healer must ascertain if the parent has sought medical attention for the child. If not, healing may be given as long as a disclaimer, see example below, has been signed.

- If a healer suspects a child is at risk or is suffering harm should report to the child's doctor or the duty officer of Social Services
- It is advisable to read and have a copy of UK Healers standards criteria where the latest laws can be found.
- This also applies to notifiable diseases.
